Council Highlights

Council recently approved a motion to reduce waste management costs by removing one bin. Residents are to transfer their large garbage (ie: furniture, renovation materiel, etc.) to the Transfer Sites.

Crammond Transfer Site —hours of operation are: Sun 2:30-5 pm; Tues, Wed & Sat 10 am—2 pm;

Caroline Transfer Site —hours of operation are: Sun 10 am-2 pm; Tues, Wed & Sat 2:30 pm—5 pm

All facilities are closed on statutory holidays.

Capital Planning Committee

Due to project changes, the Burnstick Drive project is delayed until 2011. There was some remedial work completed which included grading Burnstick Drive and the boat launch. There was also 180 cubic yards of gravel placed in between Pine Close and Poplar Close. Priorities for 2011 are #1 Burnstick Drive drainage; #2 rerouting water away from Burnstick Drive; and #3 dust abatement. Priorities inside the Village: are #1 Spruce Close, #2 Balsam Crescent, #3 Fir Close and Pine Close and #4 Poplar Close.

- Please remember only dead trees or dangerous trees in the municipal reserve (common areas) are allowed to be removed. Tree removal permits are available from all Council members. If Council determines the tree(s) are not to be removed, the tree(s) will not be tagged and you will not be allowed to remove them.
